Miss Inman began teaching in 1938 in a small school called Euchee and taught at several other schools during her career. She retired from teaching in 1980.

She moved to Columbia in 1981 and was active in the affairs of the Riverside United Methodist Church. She was a volunteer with the Maury Regional Hospital Auxiliary and a member of the Maury County Retired Teachers Association.
