April 21, 1932 - December 5, 2010

Bobby Perkins McCollough of Harriman died at his home on December 5, 2010. He was born in Columbus, Mississippi on April 21, 1932. He graduated from Harriman High School in 1951 and served in the U.S. Navy from 1952 until 1966. He moved back to Harriman in 1966 and worked at the Harriman Post Office from 1967 until he retired in 1990. He served as the Postmaster of the Harriman Post office from 1985 until his retirement. Since returning to Harriman in 1966, he also served as the Harriman Recreation Director, as a member of the Harriman City Council and Harriman Utility Board for various periods. He was a faithful Christian and was a member of the Harriman Church of Christ. His greatest pleasures came from spending time with his family, baseball and Notre Dame football. He was preceded in death by his parents, Henry McCollough and Josephine Hunt and two sisters, Elsie Hansel and Carolyn Bailey.
