



Dorothy L. Price

May 23, 1920 - November 24, 2003

Ms. Dorothy Lee Price, born May 23, 1920, died at her residence during the evening hours on November 24, 2003. She was preceded in death by her parents, Fred and Sammie Bellamy Price, and her brother, Norman L. Price. She is survived by her sister, Velma Dunsmore of Powell, Tennessee; her sister-in-law, Margaret Price and a niece, Connie Price, of Signal Mountain, Tennessee; and two nephews, Jack L. Price of Signal Mountain, Tennessee, and Michael L. Lillard of Douglasville, Georgia.

Ms. Price was a missionary employed by the National Division of the Board of Missions of the United Methodist Church. She served for many years in Maryland, Arizona, and Texas before retiring in 1973 and returning to her home in Sweetwater. Upon her return, she continued her Christian service to her church and community. She continued to provide these services in many ways, including outreach, leadership, and services for the First United Methodist Church of Sweetwater, and Girl Scouting in the Tanasi Council.

During her lifetime she was honored many times for her selfless services. These honors included: outstanding 4H leader of Texas, the Silver Fawn Award from the Boy Scouts of America, various Girl Scout awards including: the Thanks Badge, Honor Pin, Thanks Badge II, Edith Lyn Heritage Award, and the 60 year service pin. The Girl Scout Tanasi Council honored her with the creation of the Dorothy Price Diversity Award, to be given annually in her

name. The Dorothy Lee Price Scholarship Award has also been established in her honor at Hiwassee College. She has also been honored by being chosen a Channel 8 Hometown Hero.

Family and friends will gather at Westview Cemetery at 10:45 a.m. for an 11:00 a.m. committal service, followed by a Celebration of Life Service at First United Methodist Church of Sweetwater at 2:00 p.m. with the Reverend Carl Oaks officiating. The family will receive friends at the church following the service.
