



Dr. Gerald W. Strandberg

October 13, 1939 - March 24, 2010

Dr. Gerald W. Strandberg, age 70, of Harriman passed away Wednesday March 24, 2010 at Parkwest Medical Center due to a fall and resulting head injury. Jerry received a B.S. degree in biology from Loyola University ('61), Chicago, Illinois, and M. S. ('63) and Ph.D. ('66) degrees in bacteriology from the University of Wisconsin. He was a microbiologist at the Northern Regional Research Center, Peoria, Illinois, from 1966 to 1976. He retired from Oak Ridge National Laboratory after 24 years as a member of the Chemical Technology Division. During that time he had many journal articles published and received multiple patents for his research on removal of pollutants using bacterial biodegradation. He also served as an adjunct associate professor of microbiology at the University of Tennessee, Knoxville. For the past 8 years he was employed at Browder's Ace Hardware. He is preceded in death by his parents Oliver and Marcella Strandberg of Chicago, IL.

He leaves behind his loving wife of almost 50 years, Charlotte Strandberg of Harriman,
