September 10, 1922 - January 3, 2010

Henry Ford Clayton age 87 of Kingston passed away Sunday January 3, 2010 at his home. He was a member of First Baptist Church Kingston, a WWII veteran and a 50 year member of the Masons and served in the position of Worshipful Master in Lodge 653 in his hometown of Etowah, TN. He worked various jobs at Alcoa Aluminum and L&N Railroad just prior to and immediately after WWII. After working at TVA for 37yrs he retired in 1988 as Plant Manager of Kingston Steam Plant. He was preceded in death by his wife of 62 yrs Mary Alice Clayton, parents Onye Mae Rymer and Joseph Madison Clayton and brother Joe Todd Clayton.
