Jack Lamar Stewart, 90, of Locust Grove, Georgia, passed away on February 2, 2026. Born in Atlanta, Georgia, Jack was the son of the late Lester Franklin Stewart and the late Martha Inez Bagwell Stewart.

Jack was preceded in death by his wife, Alpha White Stewart.

In addition to his wife and parents, Jack was predeceased by his brothers, Larry, Douglas (Eleanor) and Joseph; his sisters, Grace Clark, Virginia, Mary Lou, and Linda; his brother-in-law, Gene Kimbrell; Great-granddaughter Tiffany Smith.

He is survived by his sisters Toby Kimbrell and Pat Horton (Bill) and his sisters-in-law Bonnie and Lillie. His children: Kenn, Angela Smith (Rick), Lee (Rebecca) and John (Shelby). He was nicknamed D.J. by his 9 grandchildren and 15 great-grandchildren.

Jack served as a cryptographer in the US Army CIC 66th division abroad (Germany) during the Korean war. After serving, Jack spent most of his life in Decatur, GA. He retired from General Motors (Lakewood and Doraville plants working in logistics). In his spare time, he was a radio and TV repairman, a

locksmith, and on game weekends he would sell novelties at college football stadiums such as Alabama (Birmingham / Tuscaloosa), UGA (Athens) and GA TECH (Atlanta).

He enjoyed his retirement with his wife of 65+ years and spending time on his goat farm in Locust Grove, GA. Jack and his wife were fond of Daytona and Ponce Inlet, FL. They visited the beach often through the years making many friends and great memories.

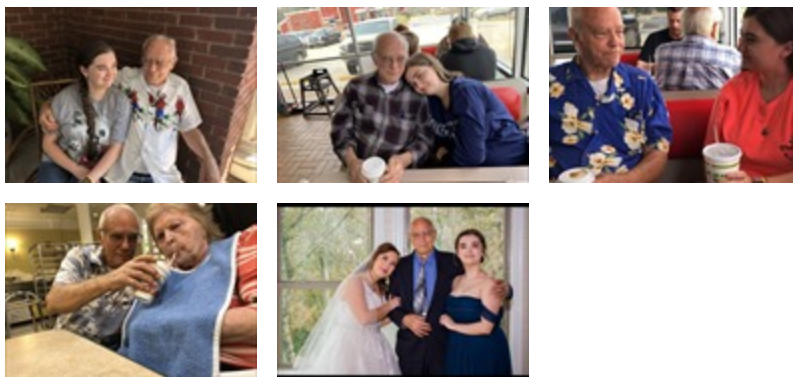
