



James Woodrow Fuller

October 17, 1918 - July 9, 2011

James Woodrow Fuller age 92 of Clinton passed away Saturday July 9, 2011 at his home. He was born October 17, 1918 in Roane County and was one of 10 children, including two sets of twins, to Johnce Caldwell Fuller and Emma DeLozier Fuller. James attended Rockwood High School. He joined the U.S. Navy in August 1937, serving 8 years and was discharged in August 1945. While in the Navy, he fought in 8 major battles during WWII, including the Battle of Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941. He was a Chief Gunner's Mate at the Time of his discharge from the Navy. On leaving the Navy, he worked in Nashville, TN for many years in the heating and air conditioning business. In 1971 Mr. And Mrs. Fuller moved with their family to Waverly, TN, where they established a heating and air conditioning business. Upon his retirement in 1980, the Fullers relocated to Mr. Fuller's hometown of Rockwood, TN. The Fullers then moved to Clinton, TN in 2005, where Mr. Fuller enjoyed gardening throughout his retirement. He was a long-time member of Young's Chapel Cumberland Presbyterian Church in Kingston.

Mr. Fuller is survived by his wife of 46 years, Valoise Johnson Fuller, his twin brother Tom Fuller, daughters Elaine Thunstrom and Valerie Erickson and husband Larry. Survivors also include two step-daughters Gale Welden and husband David, and Martha Lux and husband Jim, grandchildren Crystal Thunstrom, Hannah Lux Kay, Nathan Lux, Rachel Lux, and Lisa Welden; great-grandsons Solomon Lux, Donovan Kay, Cameron Kay and Darian Kay

and several cousins, nieces and nephews.
