James Dewitt Robertson, Jr. age 85 of Kingston, passed away December 11, 2010 at Roane Medical Center.

Born December 10, 1925, in Falling Rock, West Virginia, he was the son of James Dewitt Robertson, Sr. and Helen Derose Rader.

J.D. was a sergeant in the U.S. Army Air Force from 1944 to 1946.
