Mattie Lee Dalton age 98 of Harriman passed away on Monday, June 28, 2010 at Harriman Care and Rehabilitation Center. Mattie was a dedicated Christian and a member of Trenton Street Baptist Church since 1931. She accepted Christ as her Savior at age 12. By age 15 she was teaching a children's Sunday School class.
