November 20, 1923 - November 13, 2010

Roy L. Johnson age 86 of Kingston, TN passed away Saturday November 13, 2010 at his home after a lengthy illness. He was a member of the First Baptist Church in Kingston. Member of Hiwassee Lodge #188 F & AM in Calhoun, TN where he was presented a certificate of 50 years service in 1995. W.W.II Army Veteran, serving in the Medical Corp as a surgical tech in the 155th Station Hospital in Japan. He completed his B.S. degree from the University of Tennessee; Knoxville, TN. After graduating, he started teaching at Calhoun School, Calhoun, TN, then receiving his M.S. degree from University of TN in 1956. He served as principal of Oakdale School from 1956-58. He served as Supt. Of McMinn County School System and Supt of Rockwood City School System before being employed by the Roane County School System as Supervisor, where he retired in 1990. Preceded in death by his parents Gary and Etta Graham Johnson; brother Hughie, Wesley, Jarvis and Glen, sisters Nancy Swafford and Inez Everett.
