Roy “Bud” Nail, 77 of Kingston, passed away Tuesday May 15, 2007 after a courageous 12yr. battle with cancer. Born June 14, 1929 and originally from the Crossville area, Bud was known by many as a barber in Kingston for over 50yrs. He served as a Barber Inspector for the State of Tennessee. For many years he was a real estate broker with his own business in Kingston. He was a proud Army Veteran of the Korean War. He was a member of Masonic Lodge Union #38 and a 32nd Degree Scottish Rite Mason, Valley of Knoxville. Also a member of the Kerbela Shrine Temple of Knoxville and the American Legion.
