August 24, 1935 - March 18, 2009

A wonderful husband, friend and colleague, Warner Clifford, 73, of Kingston, TN, passed away at his home Wednesday, March 18, 2009. Born August 24, 1935 to Gardner and Janet Clifford in Worchester, Mass. Married for 50 years to Bernice Huffman Clifford.

A Registered Professional Engineer and Civil Engineering graduate from Worcester Polytechnic Institute, Warner retired from Stone & Webster Engineering Corporation in 1994 as Senior Vice President and member of the Board of Directors. As Senior Director of Construction and President of Stone and Webster Construction Company, he presided over all of the company's construction activities worldwide. Notable projects were the Beaver Valley Nuclear Power Station, Clinch River Breeder Reactor, River Bend Nuclear Power Station, and Comanche Peak Steam Electric Station. He was executive sponsor of Stone & Webster's South Region, where he provided oversight to the corporation's activities at TVA's nuclear and fossil power projects.

Warner's life is celebrated by his wife, Bernice, and his daughter, Deborah Wright and grandsons and 2 brothers,
