William Francis Ferguson of Kingston, TN passed away at his home after a long happy life. He was born April 10, 1926 in Wartrace, TN. He served in the US Navy and was a veteran of World War II. He married Nancy Ann Denning May 30, 1945 and would have been married 70 years if he had lived another week. He graduated from Vanderbilt University with a degree in Electric Engineering and worked for the Dept of Energy facilities for 48 years, and was involved in nuclear power plant engineering standards. He was a long time member of First Baptist Church in Kingston. He enjoyed politics. Was a member of the Waverly Ohio City Council, served for 20 years as a member of the Roane County Court, part of the time as a judge protempore. He enjoyed young people and was active as a boy scout leader and youth baseball manager. He was an avid hunter and fisherman. He raised quail, bird/dogs, and judged field trails. One of his favorite memories were dove hunts at Jim Watsons and passing out Nancy's Pimento Cheese Sandwiches. In addition to love of family, and the outdoors, the man loved breakfast and could do a meal of country ham, sausage, potatoes, biscuits, and gravy justice.
