William “Bill” Franklin Milburn age 75, of Kingston, TN was called home to the Lord on Sunday, March 10, 2024. Bill served as a Deacon of the Presbyterian Church of Nashville for 20 years, and as an Elder for 4 years before moving back to his roots in Roane County. Bill owned and operated Southeast Contractors, Inc. for 40 years. The company is now under the ownership of his son, Will, who operates out of the Franklin, TN office. Bill had a deep love for all animals, especially horses and rode horse trails all over the United States. Bill was a United States Army Veteran and served in the Vietnam War as the team leader for a Long-Range Reconnaissance Patrol Team.

He is preceded in death by his parents, Bill and Margie Milburn, and sister, Cynthia.

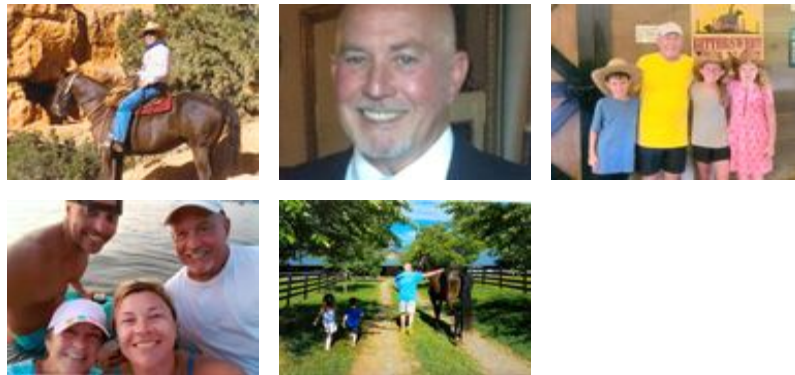

“ I first met Bill in February of 1970, 54 years ago. I had just got "in country", Vietnam. I was flown by helicopter to a landing zone on top of LZ Center in the Central Highlands. I had been attached to a Long-Range Reconnaissance Unit with a handful of other men. We were all between 20 to 22 years old with the exception of one, Willie Simpson, who had fought in the first major battle in Vietnam, the Battle of La Dang.

Bill quickly became our leader. He was a small guy but to us Bill was 6'6" and weighed 245. You didn't give Bill any lip for he was tough as nails, determined, and tenacious.

All of us in our small group were sergeants, but wore no rank. We were a bunch of young ragtag soldiers with no socks, no underwear, no dog tags, but each carried a heavy pack and an M16 fully loaded and plenty of ammo.

Being in reconnaissance we had to look and smell like the jungle. We did this for over a year with only a few days off on LZ Center to prepare for our next mission. I was fortunate enough to serve alongside Bill as his RTO. When we lost our medic without hesitation Bill threw the medical bag to me and designated me the new medic until a replacement could be had. He was that kind of a take charge guy. If there was a problem he fixed it. If there was a need he filled it. I can truly say Bill was a good leader. There was no one better than Bill!

For a brief time, in a country 12,000 miles from home, we ate together, slept together, fought together, and bled together. We were more than friends, we were brothers, a band of brothers, who's love and friendship would endure for over half a century.

Each time our little group would get together to rehash and reminisce at Bill's house, we were always greeted with open arms by Deni. Deni was so gracious and made us all feel welcome. She put up with our never-ending war stories and was the perfect hostess. We love you Deni. It is with great sadness that we say goodbye to our friend and our brother, Bill, you will never be forgotten.
